Dogs perish, man suffers minor injuries in Otho fire

Home destroyed

OTHO — A morning house fire in Otho Wednesday claimed the lives of dogs that were inside the home.

The fire at 605 N. Highway St. was reported at 8:57 a.m.

The house was a total loss, according to Otho Fire Chief Marty Smith.

Firefighters from Otho, Duncombe and Moorland all responded to extinguish the blaze.

However, there wasn't much they could do to save the house.

"The thing was completely involved when we arrived," Smith said. "All you can do is try to knock it down the best you can."

While the fire destroyed the house, firefighters were able to spare the house directly to the south, which is just a few feet away from the burned property.

"We were fairly lucky," Smith said. "It started in the north side of the house and we were able to control it from spreading to the south side of the house."

The wind was coming from the north.

"We stopped it in that end of the house so it didn't spread to the adjacent property," Smith said.

An investigation revealed the fire was caused by items that were too close to an electric fireplace.

Douglas James, 62, was the only person inside the home when the fire began. He was taken to UnityPoint Health — Trinity Regional Medical Center for treatment of his injuries.

The extent of those injuries was not known.

There were also dogs that were inside the home at the time of the fire. They did not survive. It was not immediately known how many dogs were in the house.

Smith said firefighters were on scene for about two and a half hours.

The Otho/Duncombe Police Department, Dayton Police Department and Fort Dodge Police Department were also on scene.
